This month, our church's Anti-racism Task Force (ARTF) looks at Social Justice – a term that refers to the view that everyone deserves equal rights, opportunities, and treatment regardless of their race, economic statue, sexuality, or gender identity. Social Justice is action on behalf of those who are in need; Micah refers to this as giving people their due.

Social Justice is:


- ♦ Contribution to building a better society.
