Pray for Our Leadership

Being a good steward of the offerings you provide is a responsibility I take very seriously as your pastor. My daily prayer is that **all** of us will continue seeking God's leading, wisdom, and courage as we strive to be the hands and feet of Jesus in our community.

As we close out the books on 2023, I want to provide an honest, transparent update on our church's financial status. Unfortunately, our year-end donations were lower than expected, and many of our operating expenses (utilities, insurance, salaries, and building maintenance) remain high or are increasing.

For calendar year 2023, our church income was \$388,112 but our expenses were \$450,321 for a YTD net loss of \$62,209. Our total cash reserves as of Dec. 31 were \$65,644; that **safety net**



should be closer to \$200,000 for a church of our size.

Consequently, I will be working closely with our leadership teams over the coming weeks to significantly reduce operating expenses in order to have a balanced budget moving forward. This will require some painful but necessary and strategic cuts; i.e. what utilization of resources will best position us for growth.

## United Women in Faith

In early 2020, Covid-19 began to show its ugly face, just as UWF was prepared to have its Program Book go to print. The group immediately realized that our organization was going to need to create new opportunities so Focus groups were formed. UWF members first identified that the desire for communities of faith/sisterhood is a key reason that women want to come together. They learned, from members, that the need for digital models from our print resources must include e-learning. In the summer of 2021 they started testing the Mighty Networks platform with a small group of member leaders. Two years later, during which they conducted regular surveys of members in the network, they completed the pilot phase of this online space. Mighty Networks is the platform for hosting United Women in Faith Digital since it meets the need for both online community and content development and delivery.
